The following is my monthly report of the activities and issues facing the Local since our last Central Council meeting:

**IN HOUSE MULTI-FAMILY REFUSE COLLECTION PILOT PROJECT - UPDATE**

On June 15, the Union and the City met to discuss the above pilot project that commits to use in house workers to collect waste from a multi-family service area east of the Red River commencing February 1, 2020.

Much of the discussion at the meeting focused on the implementation schedule and formation of joint sub-committees to help carry out the project. The sub-committees formed are: Operations, Fleet and Equipment, Human Resources and Financial. The sub-committees will be meeting regularly or as required, over the next year in order to meet the implementation dates.

The Local will update the membership as more information becomes available.

**CCPA RELEASES ALTERNATIVE MUNICIPAL BUDGET, WINNIPEG 2018**

The Manitoba Office of the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives (CCPA), launched its Alternative Municipal Budget Winnipeg 2018 on June 19 at City Hall.

With 2018 being an election year, the Alternative Municipal Budget is meant to stimulate discussion around how the previous administration's years of tax freezes have lead us to a crisis situation. In short, we have a historical revenue problem that has contributed to an ever-increasing infrastructure deficit.

This alternative budget provides a road map towards increasing our city's revenues and focuses expenditures on the types of services that residents of Winnipeg have come to expect and rightly deserve. I would like to commend the authors of this document for their unwavering commitment to these principles.

## **HEALTH CARE REPRESENTATION VOTES**

As reported at the last Central Council meeting, the provincial government has enacted Bill 29 – The Health Sector Bargaining Unit Review Act that will force health care members to vote for their union in the coming months.

We also told you that this process will be overseen by a Commissioner. While the government has now appointed Bob Prudent as the Commissioner, unfortunately, the government has not yet provided details about when or how these votes will happen.

In the meantime, we all need to keep working together for public health care! CUPE health care members in Manitoba are continuing to campaign to “Stop the Health Care Cuts” through advertisements, rallies, public events and distribution of signs to our community.
